

CHECKLIST TO THE DRAGONFLIES AND DAMSELFLIES OF PRESQU'ILE

Updated April, 2018

Abundance Notes: These codes refer to species in their proper habitat and during their peak season.

- **A** = Abundant: Easy to find and in large numbers.
- **C** = Common: Fairly easy to find, but not in large numbers
- U = Uncommon: May require a concentrated effort to find
- **R** = Rare: Difficult to locate, may only be semi-regular migrants/wanderers.
- V = Vagrant: Many years may pass between sightings, few park records
- V? suitable habitat exists but very few park records
